Todd Cranmore, BS, BCO, BADO

Todd Cranmore grew up around the field of ocular prosthetics, starting when his brother lost his eye at the age of 3. He completed a Bachelor of Science degree in Biochemistry at the University of Washington in 1997. Todd completed his training in 2002 and was licensed by the Washington State Department of Health. He became a Board Certified Ocularist from the National Examining Board of Ocularists in 2004. Todd has spent his career in Washington state, and is currently the President of the Washington State Society of Ocularists, as well as a member of the American Society of Ocularists, and the International Academy of Ocularistry. Todd will be presenting on "Physical, Psychological, and Social Recovery After Enucleation," a paper which he co-authored that develops a broader understanding of the physical, emotional, and psychosocial experiences of enucleation patients that can help clinicians provide better pre- and post-operative care. He works alongside his mother, Christie Erickson and wife Tawnya Cranmore at Erickson Labs Northwest in Kirkland, Washington. His interests include web design, graphic design, and wake surfing. He spends all of his free time with his wife and three kids

Jesse L. Berry, MD

Dr. Berry attended Harvard College in Cambridge, MA where she graduated cum laude with a degree in Biochemical Sciences in 2004, and went on to Harvard Medical School where she graduated in 2008 with her Medical Degree. She did her Internship at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York, her Residency in Ophthalmology at Doheny Eye Institute in Los Angeles, and her Fellowship in Ocular Oncology at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Dr. Berry is currently the Associate Director of the Retinoblastoma Program at Children's Hospital, Los Angeles, an Assistant Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology, and Associate Director of Ocular Oncology at USC Eye Institute. She is very involved in research regarding Retinoblastoma, Choroidal Melanoma, Ocular Oncology, and Clinical Outcomes. Some of her current research includes intravitreal Melphalan combined with systemic chemotherapy in the treatment of persistent vitreous seeding in advanced eyes with retinoblastoma. Combined with her research, Dr. Berry has been an invited lecturer and author of numerous peer reviewed articles as well as textbook chapters regarding Ocular Oncology.

Don O. Kikkawa, MD

Dr. Kikkawa earned a BA (magna cum laude) in biochemistry from UCSD, La Jolla and an MD (magna cum laude) from St. Louis University School of Medicine, St. Louis, Missouri. He completed his internship at the UCSD, his residency at Jules Stein Eye Institute (UCLA) and a fellowship in Ophthalmic Plastic and Orbital Surgery at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Dr. Kikkawa is currently a Professor of Clinical Ophthalmology, Chief of the Division of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and Vice Chairman at the University of California at San Diego (UCSD) Department of Ophthalmology and UCSD Shiley Eye Institute in La Jolla. Dr. Kikkawa joined the UCSD Ophthalmology faculty in 1993 and is co-director of the UCSD Thyroid Eye Center and a former program director of UCSD's ophthalmology residency. Dr. Kikkawa is on the editorial board of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (OPRS) and serves as scientific referee for several other important ophthalmology journals. He has numerous publications and has authored or contributed to several important titles on ophthalmic plastic and reconstructive surgery including: Clinical Atlas of Procedures in Ophthalmic and Oculofacial Surgery (Section Editor),

Ophthalmology Clinical and Surgical Principles, Color Atlas of Oculoplastic Surgery and Video Atlas of Oculofacial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and Midfacial Rejuvenation.

Clifton Blake Perry, MD

Dr. Perry received his undergraduate degree from Princeton University where he graduated with High Honors. He completed medical school at George Washington University followed by ophthalmology residency at one of the nation's top programs, the University of Iowa.
